We realize that masks have become a very divisive issue, but we want to act in the spirit of Christ to protect our brothers and sisters who are elderly, immune compromised, or young children. Let us remember we are gathered "in the name of Christ" and let our unity rise above our divisions.

## MCC HELPS BRING RECONCILIATION IN ETHIOPIA

Revenge is one of the most powerful human motivators, responsible for blood feuds around the globe. The Amhara region in Ethiopia is no exception. If a person is killed, the victim's family is obligated to kill someone in the offender's family, according to a tradition called Black Blood. A murderer can look forward to being murdered upon their release from prison.



For over 20 years, MCC has worked with the Meserete Kristos Church, the Mennonite church in Ethiopia, to reduce this cycle of violence. They started with one prison in Amhara and were so successful in reducing revenge murders that they were invited to expand into another.

In February 2021, MCC Country Representative Rose Shenk was privileged to witness Sera, the traditional ceremony that reconciled the family of Tegene Chernet to the families of the men who murdered him. Rose will be sharing from that experience on Saturday at the relief sale.
